

Hydrophyllum

Early leaves of the four species in Indiana



Hydrophyllum macrophyllum (native), Large-Leaved Waterleaf —Early leaves in a basal rosette, leaf 2–3 times as long as wide, soft to the touch, with hairs 1–2 mm long.



Hydrophyllum appendiculatum (native), Appendaged Waterleaf —Early leaves in a basal rosette, leaf 1½–2 times as long as wide, with hairs < 0.5 mm long.



Hydrophyllum virginianum (native), Virginia Waterleaf —Early leaves not in a basal rosette, often extending over a large area, mostly longer than wide and divided to the midvein.



Hydrophyllum canadense (native), Broad-Leaved Waterleaf —Early leaves not in a basal rosette, often extending over a large area, mostly not much longer than wide and not divided to the midvein.
