## *Hydrophyllum* Early leaves of the four species in Indiana



**Hydrophyllum macrophyllum** (native), Large-Leaved Waterleaf ——Early leaves in a basal rosette, leaf 2–3 times as long as wide, soft to the touch, with hairs 1–2 mm long.



**Hydrophyllum appendiculatum** (native), Appendaged Waterleaf ——Early leaves in a basal rosette, leaf  $1^{1/2}$ -2 times as long as wide, with hairs < 0.5 mm long.



*Hydrophyllum virginianum* (native), Virginia Waterleaf ——Early leaves not in a basal rosette, often extending over a large area, mostly longer than wide and divided to the midvein.



*Hydrophyllum canadense* (native), Broad-Leaved Waterleaf ——Early leaves not in a basal rosette, often extending over a large area, mostly not much longer than wide and not divided to the midvein.
