

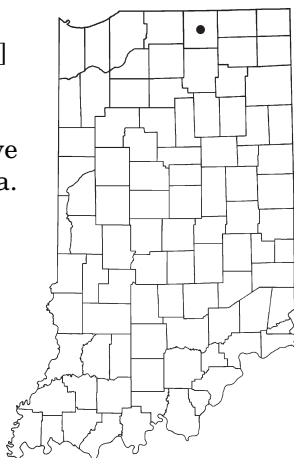
Butomus umbellatus

Flowering-Rush

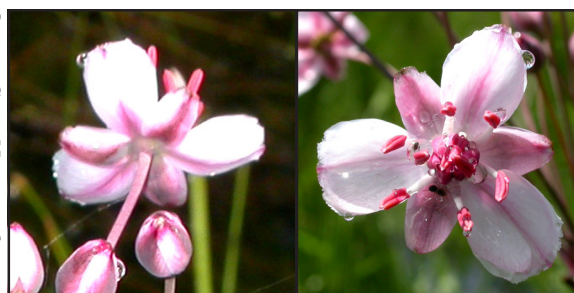
Family: Butomaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991; Judd et al. 2008]

Notes:

Butomus umbellatus is non-native in Indiana. It is native to Eurasia. The first record for Indiana was published in 1963.

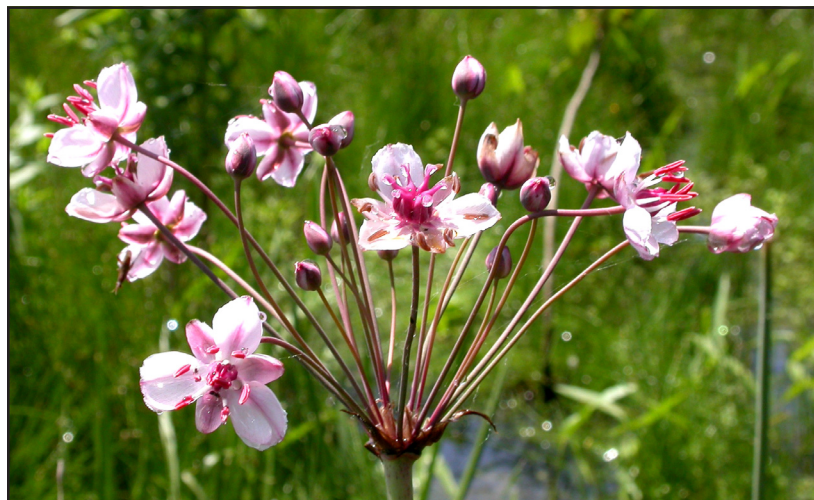
Petals 3, 10–13 mm long; sepals 3, shorter than petals; both petals and sepals pink with darker pink central area (sometimes white); stamens 9; ovaries and styles 6.

Blooms July 4–Aug 6.

Inflorescence an umbel subtended by 3 bracts, flowers 21–31, on pedicels 5–10 cm long.

Herb; scape to 1.5 m or more; leaves linear, to 100 × 1 cm.

In shallow margins of still or slowly moving waters.
