

Hydrophyllum virginianum

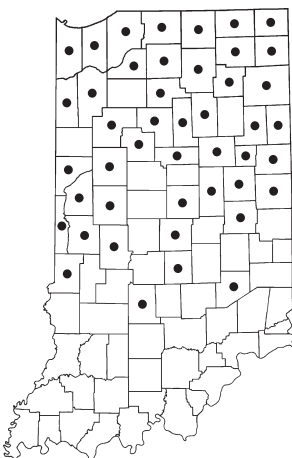
Virginia Waterleaf

Family:

Hydrophyllaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991; Boraginaceae Judd et al. 2008]

Notes:

Hydrophyllum virginianum is native in Indiana.

Corolla deeply 5-lobed, 7–10 mm long, lavender or white; calyx 5-lobed; stamens 5, long-exsert; ovary 1, style 1, long-exsert.

Blooms May 7–June 17.

Inflorescence stalks with appressed hairs mostly less than 0.5 mm long and lacking glands.

Early leaf; leaves 2–7 cm long, somewhat longer than wide, all pinnately divided.

Perennial herb 0.3–0.8 m tall, the upper part with appressed hairs mostly less than 0.5 mm long and lacking glands.

Moist forests, roadsides.
